My daughter assists me in the running of the nursery along with a very longstanding and dedicated team of staff.

Our strength is our passion and commitment for supporting children in this part of their lives. Helping them develop and grow into well-rounded individuals, ready and prepared to embark on the next stages of their education.



Welcome

Thank you for taking the time to look at our prospectus. We hope you will find it informative and find out more about our setting.

Choosing a nursery for this part of your child's developmental stage is a difficult decision you will have to face. The aim of this prospectus is to provide informative insight to what the Brentwood Day Nursery can offer you and your child.

We understand that this may not answer all of the questions you may have, but hope that this information will assist you with your decision. We do ask all parents and carers to view the nursery, it is important that children are included in the viewing process. We ask that you bring your child in to the nursery when viewing so that s/he has the opportunity to explore the setting. It also enables us to discuss your child's needs and to ensure that we can fully meet their requirements. It is also a good opportunity for your child to meet the team and their new surroundings before settling in.

We offer 2 individual settling in sessions of an hour each to children prior to their start date. This helps familiarise them and parents with the setting and routine.



Our Location

The nursery is situated within walking distance from the town and a twenty minute walk from Brentwood station. It is in the grounds of a cricket/hockey and tennis club, benefiting from the spacious grounds and parking area. It has been maintained to the highest standards to create a lovely environment in which your child will be safely cared for. The Nursery has a large secure outdoor play area and access to the surrounding fields. Admittance to the nursery is by an entry security system. The nursery occupies a large room with an additional room used for more focused and quieter activities.



Sessions

The nursery is registered to take grant-funded children; this can be accessed from the term after they have reached their third birthday. We also offer spaces for extended childcare three year entitlement (thirty hours), we have limited spaces. We can also take children who are eligible for the government two-year funding, again we have limited spaces.

We provide tailored sessions to suit all families as we know that working lives can vary from family to family. At our nursery we recognise that parents need to feel confident and comfortable with their decision.

To ensure this we operate an 'open door' policy so parents can discuss any aspect of their child's development at any time. Your child will have a key person who will act as a special person for your child who will work with you to plan, care and provide feedback about your child's activities at nursery.

Children must attend for a minimum of 2 sessions across 2 days per week. We feel this helps with the consistency including education and access to the weekly activities, which forms part of our educational curriculum.

Learning

The provision for children's development and learning is guided by the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) (DCFS 2008 /revised 2017). Children who begin their education in a learning environment that is vibrant, purposeful, challenging and supportive stand the best chance of developing into confident and successful learners. Effective learning environments are created over time as the result of partnership working. We regularly meet with parents/carers to discuss ways to support all areas of children's development. We plan to include activities more than once during the course of the week, to ensure all children have the opportunity to take part, including those who attend only for a limited number of sessions. We encourage children of all ages and stages of development to participate in the activities. The adult leading will adapt the activity to challenge and suit each individual child.

Activities and Resources

All children will be respected and their individuality potential recognised, valued and nurtured. Activities and the use of play equipment offer children opportunities to develop in an environment free from prejudice and discrimination. Appropriate opportunities will be given to children to explore, acknowledge and value similarities and differences between themselves and others.

Resources will be chosen to give children a balanced view of the world and an appreciation of the rich diversity of our multi-racial society. Materials will be selected to help children develop their self-respect and encourage respect to other people by avoiding stereotypes and derogatory pictures or messages about any group of people.

Additional Services

Children can experience a range of extra-curricular activities such as:

- Football/Tennis/Basketball/Rugby/Athletics/Dance and Drama training sessions from a professional coach's which is regularly alternated. These sessions are charged accordingly.
- Weekly French lesson from a French tutor (from 3 years old).
- Cookery and a wide range of craft activities
- Music & movement - children learn about different instruments, listen to several types of music and learn different moves.
- Makaton signing- new weekly signs will be included, encouraging children to understand and use different communication methods
- Nursery walks around the local area & surrounding fields.

Our Team

Each person is selected for their professional, caring and dedicated approach to childcare. All members of the team have a variety of qualifications including: Early years Foundation Degree, level 2 and 3 in childcare studies. Most staff hold level 3 paediatric first aid training, this ensures that each child's health and safety is always maintained. All staff have achieved safeguarding training, with two staff members holding the current level 3. All have achieved 'Prevent duty' and FGM training. Staff receive ongoing training to promote knowledge of health & safety, with one staff member at level 2 and one at level 3. Staff have achieved specific training in Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, Equality and Inclusion and Behavioural management. All staff have received training in Food hygiene, with two members at level 2. All staff have completed allergy awareness training.

Our ratio of adults to children in the setting often exceeds the EYFS welfare requirements.

The Brentwood Day Nursery is committed to furthering the professional development of our staff team through ongoing and relevant training courses that support them further in their caring role. Each child will be supported by a key person, who becomes the special person dedicated to developing secure friendships, meeting each child's needs and working closely with parents. Staff are supported by the managers and owner all of whom have years of experience and expertise.

Parent Partnership

Our setting recognises parents as first educators of their children. Staff work as partners with parents in providing care and education for children through a Key person approach. The home/setting diaries and our online developmental journal (Tapestry) are used to share information about children and provide an outline of the weekly activities and learning. We enjoy celebrating and sharing children's achievements (whether they were at home or nursery) with parents on a regular basis. These are recorded and used to form part of their learning journey. Parents are regularly updated via Tapestry as to each goal achieved at nursery and their participation in various activities. An art journal created from children's pictures is built through their time at nursery. These make a wonderful keepsake of their nursery life.

Our termly newsletter helps to keep parents regularly updated with news and upcoming events. We have a Facebook page which is used to provide notifications of events and any required items for nursery.

When you visit, we are sure you will have many questions and want to have a good look around. We therefore request that you book an appointment to give you sufficient time (approximately 30-40 mins).

A Typical Day

This timetable gives you an overview of the layout of a typical day at our nursery. Occasionally unplanned events may occur requiring a change in the routine to make the most of the eventuality.

8:30am – 11:45am	Free play: book corner, construction, small world play, home corner including dress up box, ICT equipment, writing and drawing, puzzles
8:30am – 9:30am	Focused activity: a fun planned activity to help promote children's learning in various areas, with a set learning objective.
9:00am – 9:30am	Music and movement/Magic bag: children are invited to take part in a drama based story or music and movement session.
9:30am – 10:30am	Physical play: physical pursuits such as ride on toys, climbing frame, trampolining etc, these help promote fine and gross motor development
9:30am – 10:00am	Snack time: social time to chat and encourage children's participation.
10:30am – 11:00am	Songs / Story time / Circle time / Phonics: Learning letter sounds through music or with visual aids. These activities promote turn taking and help build confidence.
10:30 – 11:30am	Planned activity: child led activities related to the current theme.
11:45am – 12:15pm	Lunch: weekly menu is included in children's diary books.
12:15pm – 12:45pm	Songs / Story time / Circle time / Phonics: Learning letter sounds through music or with visual aids. These activities promote turn taking and help build confidence.
12:45pm – 5:30pm	Free play: book corner, construction, small world play, home corner including dress up box, ICT equipment, writing and drawing, puzzles
1:30pm – 2:30pm	Physical play: physical pursuits such as ride on toys, climbing frame, trampolining etc, these help promote fine and gross motor development.
2:00pm – 3:00pm	Focused activity: a fun planned activity to help promote children's learning in various areas, with a set learning objective.
2:00pm – 2:30pm	Music and movement/Magic bag: Children are invited to take part in a drama based story or music and movement session.
2:00pm – 2:15pm	Snack: Social time to chat and encourage children's participation.
2:45pm – 3:30pm	Planned activity: child led activities related to the current theme.
3:00pm – 3:30pm	Songs / Story time / Circle time / Phonics: Learning letter sounds through music or with visual aids. These activities promote turn taking and help build confidence.
3:30pm – 4:00pm	Afternoon tea: weekly menu is included in children's diary books.
4:00pm – 4:30pm	Physical play: physical pursuits such as ride on toys, climbing frame, trampolining etc, these help promote fine and gross motor development.

Meal times

Snack time is mid-way through each morning and afternoon session (10am and 2pm). Children are encouraged to sit and chat to each other developing their social skills. We include fresh and dried fruit in both snack

sessions. We involve children in the preparation and serving snack in their groups which helps support independence and self-help skills.



Lunch consists of a range of tasty and nutritious home cooked food. Usually served around 11.40am. Children are offered a main dish, vegetables, dessert and a drink, all cooked and prepared on site by our fully qualified chef. We cater to all allergies, cultural and dietary requirements. Parents are encouraged to discuss and review these on a regular basis. We have detailed information of all Food Allergens and this can be viewed at any time on request.

Nursery lunches will follow a healthy balanced rolling menu (4 weekly), which will be reviewed and updated regularly by our chef who understands the nutritional needs of young children. Our menus are divided into summer & winter menus.

Tea is provided later in the afternoon (3.30pm) offering dishes such as soup, scrambled egg, sandwiches or similar healthy option, with fresh fruit. We have a 5-star rating for our food & hygiene from the Food Standards Agency. To check out our rating please follow the link.

The nursery is open throughout the year, closing bank holidays and between Christmas and New Year. We also close for one other day in the year when the cricket club holds its annual charity event, you will be notified of the date.
